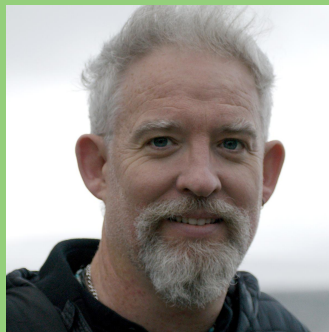

Loah, a.k.a. Sallay Garnett, is an Irish / Sierra Leonean singer-songwriter and instrumentalist.



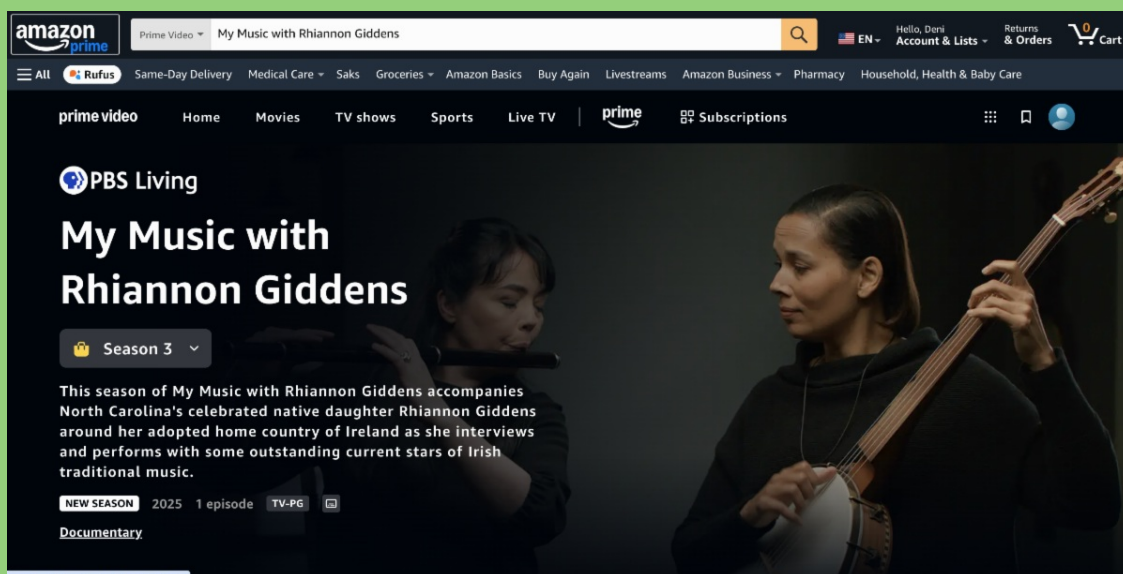
Niwel Tsumbu is a guitarist and singer from the Congo who studied classical music in Central Africa before moving to Ireland in 2004.

Emer Mayock learned to play tin whistle as a child and has since become a master on flute and uilleann pipes.

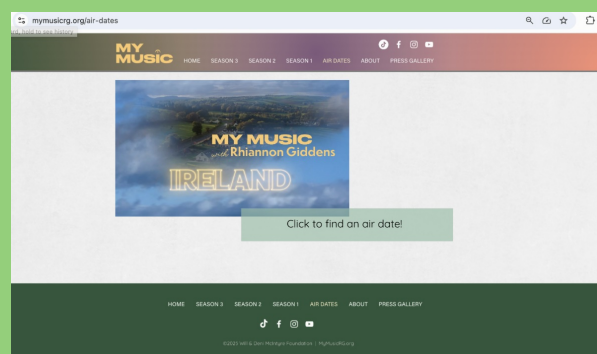


You're not in the US? Cool.

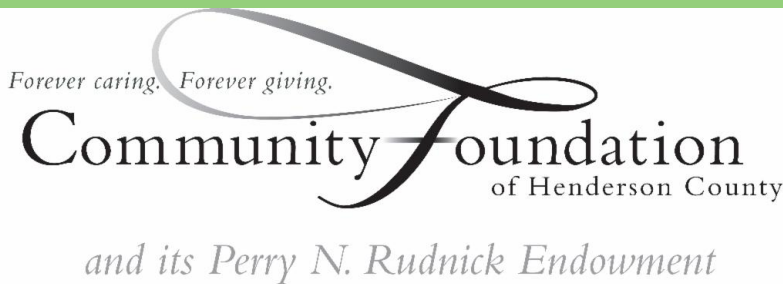
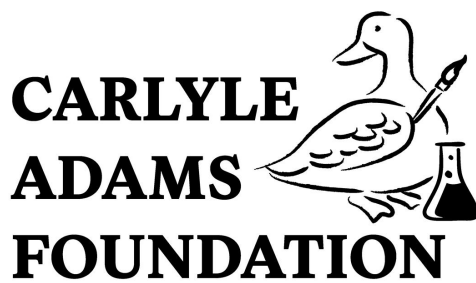
